

1. Purpose

- 1.1. This policy is prepared to direct the Sunway University community in taking a unified and collective approach away from a culture of disposables and towards one of reusables, aiding in solid waste reduction.
- 1.2. This policy is focusing on single-use plastics used by food & beverage tenants, campus stores (bookshop, photoshop) and vending machines.
- 1.3. Sunway community refers to anyone present on campus (staff, students, tenants, visitors, vendors, etc.).
- 1.4. The effectiveness of this policy will require structured and coordinated efforts from all parties involved to identify and reduce single-use plastics and switch to reusable alternatives wherever possible.

2. Negative Impact of Single-Use Plastic

- 2.1 Single-use plastic is prohibited on campus as it has the following negative impacts on the environment and our well-being:
 - Disposable plastic is not biodegradable. It is simply burned, and it contributes to
 - greenhouse gas emissions.
 - Microplastics, smaller plastic particles that result from single-use plastic breaking down,
 - pollute water sources and expose humans to damaging health effects.
 - The single-use plastic trade amplifies the exploitation of countries in the Global South while
 - increasing global plastic waste.

3. Type of Single-Use Plastic

- 3.1. Single-use plastic refers to plastic items that are discarded after it is used once, also called disposable plastics and are commonly used in packaging.
- 3.2 Common examples of single-use plastic items include:
 - Plastic straws
 - Plastic cutlery (forks, spoons, etc.)
 - Plastic shopping carrier bags
 - Plastic and Styrofoam coffee cups, lids, and takeaway containers
 - Plastic water bottles
 - Plastic food preparation gloves

5. Compliance from Sunway Community

5.1 All Tenants

- The food & beverages tenants, campus retail stores and vending machines on the Sunway Campus shall, at all times, fully cooperate and participate in these sustainable initiatives.
- Tenants and vendors are not allowed to sell, provide or distribute single-use plastic products on campus, such as plastic-bottled mineral water and plastic straws.

5.2 All Staff & Students

• All staff and students are responsible for complying with this Policy as it applies to their activities on campus, such as events, conferences, meetings, etc.



- Event organisers who conduct activities on campus are encouraged to use catering services with reusable food ware.
- Participants and guests who attend these events are encouraged to bring their own containers, tumblers, metal straws, etc.
- 5.3 Third-party Vendors
 - Third-party vendors are the external parties that rent a space on the Sunway campus to sell and distribute food & beverages and other merchandise.
 - These vendors are required to fulfil all the relevant criteria Sunway sets, which is not to sell, provide and/or distribute any products related to Single-Use Plastics on campus.

6. Good Sustainable Practices

- 6.1 Single-use plastics
 - Plastics constitute a significant source of environmental degradation and long-term health issues. Hence, Sunway is committed to acting toward the reduction and elimination of single-use plastic, which is in line with the Campus' sustainability goals, but also in recognition of the devastating role single-use products play in the global environmental impact.

6.2 Reduce Single-use plastics

 In order to reduce single-use plastics, Sunway requires the compliance of the parties outlined above. It is the responsibility of all to eliminate the sale and free distribution of single-use plastic and/or disposable products and instead provide reusable alternatives. Hence inspiring demand for a more sustainable consumption pattern.
