Keynote Speaker

The Interplay of Technology and Cognition for Liberal Learning

Dr. Azly Rahman is a global educator, columnist, author of nine books and over 400 articles on Malaysia, Global Affairs, Social Sciences, Philosophy, and Literature. He is, an alumni of the International and Transcultural Studies program at Columbia University, New York. He holds a doctorate in international education development and six Masters Degrees in the fields of Education, Communication, International Relations, Peace Studies, and the Humanities. He currently teaches Cultural Perspectives, Psychology, World History, Global Issues, and Sociology of the Future, in the US.

In this presentation, I draw on 35 years as an educator In the United States and Malaysia and discuss the design of educational institutions based on ideas of Singularity and Multiplicity, Chaos, Critical and Complexity theories. I will speak of how to see culture, technology, ecology, human dignity, and creativity harmonize in educational architecture. I focus on the importance of Global Cultural Competency and Futurism as new foundations of global education. At the heart of this worldview lies the Progressive-Existentialist philosophy of education centering around the Self in the New Society, Post-Pandemic. How will Malaysian education, too, prepare for these mega structural philosophical changes? We will explore this theme of inquiry.

Professor Graeme Wilkinson

Professor Graeme Wilkinson is the Vice-Chancellor of Sunway University, Malaysia, a post he has held since 2012. Prior to that he worked in senior roles in three UK universities. His most recent book, "Managing Effect-ively in Academia", is a handbook of good practice for academic leaders and managers in higher education.



Professor Dr. Mohd. Tajuddin Mohd. Rasdi

Professor Dr Mohamad Tajuddin Mohamad Rasdi, writes and speaks on architecture, politics, social issues, religious matters and education. Educated in USA and UK, he holds masters and PhD degrees in architecture. He has won four National Book awards and currently is a columnist for The Star and Sin Chiew Daily. Recently, he received a Kuala Lumpur and Selangor Chinese Assembly Hall (KLSCAH) for critical media writings and is Council Member of the Majlis Perundingan Keharmonian Rakyat.



Datuk Dr. Johan Ariffin Samad

Datuk Dr Johan Ariffin Samad, formerly CEO of Sabah government think tank, Institute for Development Studies, has worked with several multinational corporations, been Deputy Director of Sabah State Foundation for education development and spearheaded Sabah's oil and gas development. He is a member of G25, adviser to several NGOs like MAJU, and works closely with civil societies. Dr Johan holds DBA (University of South Australia) and MBA (University of Hull).



The Honorable Mr. Baru Bian

Baru Bian is a Member of Parliament for Selangau, Sarawak and of the Sarawak State Assembly for Ba' Kelalan. Started his legal career in Kuala Lumpur in 1986, Baru set up his own firm in 1992 to take up the mantle of defending the Native Customary Rights of the indigenous people of Sarawak against the unjust policies of the State government. . In 2018, he won the parliamentary seat of Selanga and was appointed Minister of Works, a post he held until February 2020.
