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President's Preface

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I'm very pleased to introduce the Annual Review 2022 on Sunway University's achievements.

It was a very different year from the previous two years because staff and students could finally return to campus. For some of the students this was their first on-campus experience, and they enjoyed the 'most happening campus' to the fullest. We also had several graduation ceremonies in the Amphitheatre in the Lagoon, allowing students and their families to celebrate their achievements. Looking back, the University did very well in protecting the health of our students and staff and at the same time, making sure that their education and research progressed during the pandemic. Our student recruitment was 7% higher than our previous year and the total student number went up to 8,800. We introduced four new programmes in 2022, including our second engineering programme in Chemical Engineering and new master's and PhD programmes. In April, Professor Abhimanyu Veerakumarasivam was appointed as Provost, succeeding Professor Peter Heard, who returned to the United Kingdom after nearly ten years at the University.

The number of publications in Scopus increased in 2022 by nearly 13% at 973 and, more importantly, the quality of these publications as measured by citations per paper in Scopus as well as in the Web of Science, was top among Malaysian research-intensive universities and among the best in Asia and the World. The amount of external grants awarded to the University increased again with several sizable international grants. Sunway Business School doubled the number of publications in Business, Management, Economics and Finance to 180, and also achieved one of the highest citations per paper in the world. The school also obtained the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) accreditation as the first Private Non Government-Linked Malaysian University to do so, and joining the top 5% of business schools worldwide.

The University also continued to attract top scientists. A few examples are Associate Professor Arshian Sharif who joined us in May as a top 2% scientist in the Stanford list, but also named in the Clarivate Highly Cited list as one of less than 7,000 scientists in the world. Professor Lim Weng Marc came as the new dean of the Sunway Business School in September and is a highly productive top 2% scientist. Other top 2% scientists who joined us during the year were Professor Long Chiau Ming (in Pharmacy) and Dr Katta Ramesh (in Mathematics). Other notable appointments were Professor Raja Affendi Raja Ali who came in as the new Dean of the School of Medical and Life Sciences. Professor Elilarasu Renganathan who was previously with the World Health Organisation (WHO), has also joined the School of Medical and Life Sciences.

Sustainability is key to Sunway Berhad, Sunway City, Sunway Education Group and Sunway University. To this end, the Sunway Centre for Planetary Health was established in 2021 at Sunway University under the leadership of Professor Tan Sri Dr Jemilah Mahmood and many sustainability-focused activities were developed in 2022. In December 2022 we celebrated the opening of the United Nations Sustainable Development Solutions Network (UN-SDSN) Kuala Lumpur office for Asia at Sunway University, complementing the offices in New York and Paris. In 2022, pilot studies were performed for the *Matapelajaran Pengajian Umum* (MPU) general studies subjects on Planetary Health and Community Service, on Sustainable Development and on Entrepreneurship, to be expanded in 2023 and fully implemented in 2024/2025.

Sunway University entered the Times Higher Education Ranking for the first time, at Band #801-1000, as the first and highest ranked Malaysian Private Non Government -Linked University. It also featured for the very first time in the subject rankings for Business & Economics at band #301-400 and for Physical Sciences at band #601-800.

We made good progress again in the Quacquarelli Symonds (QS) World University Rankings, rising from the #651-700 band to the #601-650 band globally and #122 in the Asia region. Our School of Hospitality and Service Management services was ranked #101-150 globally in the QS subject ranking. In the Times Higher Education Impact Rankings 2022, we ranked in the top 400 overall and top 200 for SDGs 6, 8 and 17 and in Universitas Indonesia GreenMetric we progressed upwards to #189.

Several international conferences were organized by the University, both in person as well as in hybrid mode. Overall, Sunway University made significant steps towards becoming a top research-intensive private university in Southeast Asia. I trust that you will find the details in this Annual Report of interest.

Sunway University was listed among the Top 10 Most Prominent Data Science Institutes 2022 in the Analytics Insight Magazine

The University's graduates from the business analytics programme recorded an employment rate of 97% in the 2021 Graduate Tracer Study survey conducted by the Ministry of Higher Education Malaysia.





Professor Peter Doherty, 1996 Nobel Laureate in Physiology or Medicine gave an online presentation to our staff and students. The event was organised through the Nobel Prize Inspiration Initiative in collaboration with Astra Zeneca.



A course on Sustainable Development Goals Education was made available to all students and staff at Sunway University to drive the sustainability agenda on campus and in the community.

This is an important initiative that the University has embarked on to realise Sunway Group's vision to be Asia's model corporation in sustainable development and achieve the 2030 Agenda.

APRIL - JUNE

Sunway University once again emerged as the highest-ranked private university in Malaysia in the Times Higher Education (THE) Impact Rankings 2022.





Sunway University rolled out its Career Readiness Programme (CRP) to prepare students for their future careers starting from preuniversity to graduate level.

The programme aims to develop graduates who would be equipped for all of life's challenges and opportunities as well as being highly sought-after by employers. The British Malaysian Chamber of Commerce awarded the 'UK-Malaysia Education Institutional Partnership' for Sunway University's partnership with Lancaster University and the 'UK-Malaysia Partnership of the Year' for Sunway University's partnership with AstraZeneca during its Business Excellence Awards 2022.





Minister of Higher Education Malaysia, YB Datuk Seri Dr. Noraini Binti Ahmad witnessed the Signing Ceremony of Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between University of Cambridge, UK and Sunway University through the Jeffrey Cheah Foundation, in Cambridge, United Kingdom.

The MoU signed is a continuation of cooperation that has formed over the past two decades and this partnership strengthens the links between Cambridge University and Sunway University whilst benefiting strategic bilateral ties between Malaysia and the UK.



The Sunway University Young Chefs published a cookbook of transforming edible food waste into new dishes. The book entitled 'Edible Waste: a Cookbook' won the Food Waste Book category at the Gourmand World Cookbook Awards 2022 held in Sweden.


JULY - SEPTEMBER



Sunway University hosted the 2022 ASEAN Quality Assurance Conference themed 'Emerging from Crisis: Refining Quality Assurance Toward Stability in Higher Education'.

The conference encompassed the progress of academic, research, assessment and quality assurance practices over the COVID-19 lifespan on a scale of international cross-comparison.

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Sunway University finished at third placing in the overall medal tally (out of 65 institutions) in the prestigious 2022 SUKIPT competition, a biennial intervarsity sports carnival amongst public and private universities, as well as polytechnics and community colleges in Malaysia.

Bagging 44 medals in total (15 gold, 18 silver, and 11 bronze), the University maintained its leading position amongst the Private Higher Education Institutions for the past four game seasons.

Sunway University Press published three books among the 50 Best Malaysian Titles for International Rights 2021/2022 by the National Book Council of Malaysia, Ministry of Education, Malaysia. The publications were featured at the Frankfurt Book Fair 2022, the World's largest and most important trade fair for books.



The three books were 'Colours of Malaysia: The Art of Amirudin

Ariffin' (Graeme Wilkinson & Bo Li), 'The Science of Feelings: What Psychological Research Tells Us About Our Emotions' (Eugene Tee) and 'Mending Hearts: Healing from Separation and Loss, a Collection of True Stories' (edited by Mengzhen Lim & Grace Yap).



In conjunction with the 7th anniversary of the worldwide launch of the United Nation's Sustainable Development Goals, Sunway University held a weeklong festival in September. The continuing call to action focusing on the theme of Local Action for Global Goals brought together government representatives, nongovernmental organisations, student societies and the campus community for conversations to advance the Global Goals through local and individual action.

To this end, alternative food packaging solutions were introduced, to reduce waste generation from the campus cafeteria. Environmentally friendly products were also sold while purchasing options that promoted zero packaging waste were introduced.

OCTOBER - DECEMBER

Sunway Business School successfully earned accreditation from the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) and become the first private Malaysian university to attain this globally prestigious accreditation.

AACSB is the longest-serving global accrediting body and a Gold standard for business schools, with less than 6% of business schools worldwide holding this distinguished accreditation.





The University was ranked for the first time in the Times Higher Education (THE) World University Rankings 2023. Sunway University is at the band 801-1000, out of 1,799 universities, across 104 countries and regions.

The Business & Economics and Physical Sciences subjects have secured #301-400 and #601-800 positions globally in the largest and most diverse university rankings.



The United Nations Sustainable Development Solutions Network (SDSN) launched its newest secretariat office in Asia, hosted at Sunway University. The office in Sunway City Kuala Lumpur will serve as SDSN's Asia Headquarters, one of only three such global centers, alongside Paris and New York City.



'A Legacy of Giving', was an event organised for the first time to appreciate Sunway alumni who have contributed back to the community. The event was presided by Sunway University's Chancellor, Tan Sri Dato Seri' Dr Jeffrey Cheah AO.

ACADEMIC ENHANCEMENT


The year 2022 saw the campus returning to its pre-pandemic status as a vibrant learning hub.

The Academic Enhancement Division (AED), an entity that is responsible for supporting academic staff development teaching and related academic practices, reviewed its provision to ensure that academic staff development needs were met. To this end, the following was provided:

- Workshops and trainings were regularly offered in three modes to accommodate staff's needs i.e. fully online, fully face-to-face or hybrid/flipped.
- Significant number of provisions focused on technology integration in teaching to fulfil the high demand.

Academic staff were highly satisfied with the programmes, as reflected by the high participation and satisfaction rate.

- 1st and 2nd prizes went to academics from the School of Mathematical Sciences.





- The programme is a testimony to Sunway University's commitment towards providing high quality learning experience to students, via its academic staff qualification and professional recognition in teaching and is open to all academic staff from Sunway University and Sunway College.
- The inaugural intake was in August 2022 with all successful applicants receiving a scholarship from their respective institutions.



PROFESSIONAL AND CONTINUING EDUCATION

The Professional and Continuing Education (PACE) department was established in June with the responsibility of promoting lifelong learning objectives of Sunway University. PACE supports the offering of a wide range of professional and continuing education courses, both credit and non-credit-bearing, such as micro-credentials and other short courses. The department also aims to achieve the provision of Accreditation for Prior Experiential Learning (APEL) and drive innovative approaches for delivering online and distance learning (ODL) courses at Sunway University.

Within six months of its establishment, PACE received the approval to access students via Accreditation of Prior Experiential Learning for Credit (APEL.C) as well as Accreditation of Prior Learning for Access (APEL.A).

PACE also supported the launch of four online and distance learning programmes:

- 1. Master in Sustainable Development Management
- 2. Master in Public Policy
- 3. Master of Business Administration
- 4. Master of Data Science



In a concerted effort to align with the University's aspirations of expanding access and opportunities to students, three *Matapelajaran Pengajian Umum* (MPU) Online courses had undergone a comprehensive overhaul;

1) MPU 3222: Entrepreneurial Mindset and Skills

Armed with the fundamental belief that everyone (and anyone) can become an entrepreneur, this course introduces learners to the entrepreneurial mindset and skills relevant in the 21st Century through exciting gamified content.

2) MPU 3312: Sustainable Development in Malaysia

With key sustainability related issues becoming more prevalent in our daily lives, exploration on why addressing sustainability challenges is important and why there is a need to start taking note of the SDGs - in the localised Malaysian context.


3) MPU 3412: Community Service for Planetary Health



STANFORD UNIVERSITY ORLD'S TOP 2% SCIENTISTS 2022

Stanford University recently conducted a study examining the citation metrics of more than 160,000 scientists across 22 scientific fields and 176 subfields. Citation metrics are commonly used to gauge the significance and relevance of a particular research topic. As part of the study, a comprehensive list of top researchers, representing the top 2% of scientists globally, was published, which included 20 researchers from Sunway University.







In 2006, Sunway University (the then Sunway University College) established its partnership with Lancaster University and celebrated its 15th year anniversary of partnership in 2021/2022. From an initial graduating cohort of six students in 2008, today we have more than 6,000 students enrolled in a comprehensive range of programmes; whereby after completion of their degree programmes, students are awarded certificates from both, Sunway University and Lancaster University. The collaboration has helped to establish both institutions domestically as well as expand its international network and impact.



The Sunway University-Lancaster University partnership has emerged as one of the world's most successful transnational higher educational partnerships. According to the UK's Higher Education Statistics Agency (HESA) Aggregate Offshore Record, for the latest three academic years where data is available, 2019/20, 2020/21 and 2021/22, Lancaster University has recorded the largest number of transnational education enrolments in Malaysia, among all UK higher education institutions. This makes the Sunway-Lancaster partnership the largest UK-Malaysia Transnational Education (TNE) partnership. In 2021/22, the partnership accounted for 15.8% of all the UK TNE enrolments in Malaysia.

As the partnership between both institutions matures towards two decades of collaboration, the nature of the partnership that was solely focused on teaching has also transformed holistically to extend to research engagement and service impact to the quadruple helix of policy-industry-academiasociety nexus. The Sunway-Lancaster partnership has and continues to promote its tripartite mission. of Education, Research and Service.

Campus Sustainability

2022 saw the campus-wide sustainability efforts through the Smart Sustainable Campus Committee (SSSC) being re-branded as 'Campus with A Conscience' (CWAC). With this rebrand, ongoing activities such as the CWAC Live Webinar Series as well as the annual United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UNSDGs) anniversary event continued to thrive. This year, the week-long United Nations Global Campaign of Local Action for Global Goals 2022 in conjunction with the worldwide 7th Anniversary of the launch of the UNSDGs, celebrated all campus-wide SDG initiatives. The events were open to the surrounding local community so that they may better appreciate the University's sustainability efforts.



Education

CWAC successfully developed and launched an online SDG Education Course campus-wide in partnership with the SDG Academy. The course is designed to strengthen our staff and students' foundational understanding of the United Nations 2030 Agenda and its 17 SDGs.

Aside from educating staff and students on campus, new hires were also introduced to the concept of sustainability through the development of a board game 'Are you the Master of Sustainability' which was incorporated into the new hires' orientation programme. New recruits are expected to learn about Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) and SDGs, to prepare them on their career journey with Sunway. The board game was designed and developed by Sunway University's staff from the Jeffrey Sachs Centre for Sustainable Development (JSC) as well as the students of the Master in Sustainable Development Management, to help educate players on the need to find solutions to some of the most pressing social and environmental issues in Malaysia and the World today.



Leadership

In conjunction with International Women's Day 2022, the University celebrated female scientists who have contributed significantly to making the institution one of Malaysia's top-cited private research universities. The University has played a leading role in recognising and acknowledging the role of female scientists in the nation and the World in addressing global challenges and impact. Sunway University has female scientists across various sectors such as Engineering and Technology, Arts, Medical and Life Sciences, Hospitality and Service Management, Mathematical Sciences, Business, English Language and Sustainable Development.



Research

The Sunway Materials Smart Science and Engineering Cluster (SMS2E) launched the food waste project to better address SDG 12: Responsible Consumption and Production. This project has been put together by the efforts of professionals from various disciplines including chefs, psychologists, scientists, engineers, social scientists, and economists. The University is committed to repurposing food waste by converting it into value-added products, with composting being one of the solutions.



Stewardship

The Start-up Foundry, an entrepreneurship programme launched by Sunway Innovation Labs (iLabs) in collaboration with the School of Engineering and Technology, through their Launch X incubator programme successfully assisted several start-ups by connecting them with mentors, speakers, and participants from different start-ups teams. Among the start-ups that benefited from this programme were those founded by our very own alumni - Greenbox, the first manufacturing company in Malaysia that produces boxes from agro-waste and OPACK, a smart returnable container logistics system for businesses to reduce single-use plastic packaging.



Sunway University researchers from the Graphene and Advanced 2D Materials Research Group (GAMRG) worked on a proprietary heat transfer nanofluid which has improved energy efficiency in industrial applications and reduced daily energy consumption by up to 10 per cent (kwH). The nano-fluid results in almost 40 per cent faster heat transfer; transferring the same amount of heat in a much shorter time. Chillers are one of the largest electricity consumers in a building and could consume up to 40 per cent of a building's total energy use in commercial and industrial buildings. The pilot trial of graphene-based nano-fluid in industrial chillers was a joint project together with Daikin Refrigeration Malaysia Sdn. Bhd. and Sunway Innovation Lab (iLabs).
