Sunway University announced the launch of its "Community In Action" campaign to promote crime prevention and awareness among students and the broader community. The campaign includes various crime prevention and awareness sessions, exhibitions in partnership with Malaysia Crime Prevention Foundation (MCPF), Royal Malaysia Police (PDRM), National Anti-Drugs Agency (AADK), and other

The University aims to instil in its students a sense of responsibility as active and responsible citizens within the community. The launch was graced with presence of Founder & Chairman of Sunway Group, Tan Sri Dato' Seri Dr Jeffrey Cheah AO, Chairman of Malaysia Crime Prevention Foundation (MCPF) Selangor, YDH CP Dato' Hussein bin Omar Khan, Selangor Police Chief, Dato' Seri Ayub bin Yaakob, Malaysia Crime Prevention Foundation (MCPF) EXCO members and Subang Jaya State Assemblywoman, YB Michelle Ng.









Situated in Sunway City and as part of the Sunway Education Group, Sunway University and Sunway College have over 21,000 students. With the presence of other private higher educational institutions, international schools, public primary and secondary schools in the vicinity, the collective student population in and around Bandar Sunway reaches 60,000. These students play an integral role in the broader community of Sunway City.

The concept stems from Sunway Education Group's initiative to raise awareness among its students, as well as students from neighbouring institutions, on crime and crime prevention in the community. The campaign aims to be an integral part of community-based activities.

By emphasising individual actions and responsibilities, students are encouraged to prevent crime by acting as witnesses, intervening in appropriate situations, taking precautions to safeguard their property, practising online safety, and respecting their fellow students. Sunway University also intends to engage with the broader community through various activities, demonstrating their commitment to being an active participant in community-building efforts.

In his welcome speech, Tan Sri Dato' Seri Dr. Jeffrey Cheah emphasised the importance of community engagement in crime prevention. He highlighted the rise of technology-enabled crimes such as online fraud and identity theft, emphasising the need for law enforcement to stay equipped and trained to counter such threats. He also expressed his gratitude to the Malaysia Crime Prevention Foundation, the Royal Malaysia Police, and the National Anti-Drugs Agency for their support in this mission.

Sunway City Kuala Lumpur, with its annual 42 million visits and a vibrant community of over 200,000 residents, prioritises the safety and security of its students, residents, and visitors. The city has long-standing partnerships with the Malaysian Crime Prevention Foundation and has implemented advanced security measures such as over 5,000 CCTV cameras with facial recognition capabilities. The security personnel, alongside the auxiliary police and the Royal Malaysian Police, conduct regular joint-patrol sessions to ensure a safe environment.

The launch of the "Community In Action" campaign is a testament to Sunway University's commitment to long-term crime prevention efforts. Through collaboration with stakeholders, including students, faculty, law enforcement agencies, and the community, Sunway University aims to build a safer, more secure, and harmonious Malaysia.

Sunway University has been awarded the number one Graduate Employability among all universities in Malaysia by Talentbank for the second consecutive year.

The University received 6 Stars Employability Rating in 25 different fields of study including Accounting, Actuarial Science, Engineering, Hospitality Management and many more. 
How much of myself is enough for me to feel like myself?







Every August and September, Malaysia celebrates its national day on two dates, Merdeka Day (Independence Day) and Malaysia Day, to mark the liberation from colonial rule.

Malaysians will definitely be familiar with the name - Tunku Abdul Rahman, the founding father of Malaya's independence who was also the first Prime Minister of Malaysia. He led a delegation of ministers and political leaders in negotiation for the state's independence with the British Government in London.

On 31 August 1957, Tunku stood in front of a 20,000 crowd at the Merdeka Stadium and shouted 'Merdeka' seven times, proclaiming the independence of the nation. The ceremony continued with the raising of the National Flag of Malaya – Jalur Gemilang accompanied by the national anthem being played by the military band and a 21-gun salute, followed by prayers in honour of this great occasion.

Merdeka Day falls on 31 August every year and is celebrated with a grand parade showcasing various performances and march-past from all walks of life.





## THE FORMATION OF 'MALAYSIA'

Before 1963, Malaysia was in fact known as the Federation of Malaya which consisted of 11 states in the peninsula. The Federation of Malaysia was formed with the merger of Malaya, North Borneo (Sabah), Sarawak and Singapore on 16 September 1963.

The declaration of Malaysia ceremony was held at Stadium Merdeka Kuala Lumpur with the presence of the Yang di-Pertuan Agong (Supreme Head of the Federation), the Malay Rulers, and the Governor of Penang, Malacca, Singapore, Sarawak and Sabah, cabinet members, and foreign diplomats in Kuala Lumpur. The glorious event was attended by about 30,000 Malaysians to celebrate this historical moment.

Prior to the formation of Malaysia, the Cobbold Commission was established in 1962 to determine whether the people of North Borneo and Sarawak supported the merging of the Federation of Malaya, Singapore, North Borneo and Sarawak. Final reports and insights from the Commission concluded the formation of a new nation called Malaysia, which is now celebrated on 16 September every year.

Singapore was separated from Malaysia in 1965 and became an independent and sovereign state.

# THE NATIONAL FLAG

Known as the Stripes of Glory or Jalur Gemilang, the national flag consists of a field of red and white stripes, a blue canton bearing a crescent and a 14-point star known as the Bintang Persekutuan (Federal Star). The stripes mark the membership of the 13 states and the federal territories, while the 14-point star represents the unity among these entities. The colour yellow on the crescent and star represents the Royal colour of the Malay Rulers; the crescent represents the country's state religion, Islam; and the blue canton symbolises the unity of the Malaysian people.


