


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Dr Sally Anne Malar Param has been teaching at the Australian Matriculation Programme for the past 6 years, where she is the Subject Lead for two subjects, English and General English. In both subjects, Sally leads a small team of lecturers to work towards improving skills as educators. Apart from lead lecturer roles, Sally is also involved in roles that highlight personal wellness. She is a member of the We Care team which looks into the needs of at-risk students, and the department representative for the Staff Association of Sunway.

From 2018 to 2019, Sally was part of a collaboration team at the Jeffrey Sachs Center on Sustainable Development (JSC) to brainstorm new curriculum content. In 2019-2021, she is also a part of the supervisory team which supports the Masters in Sustainable Development programme (MSDM).

Sally's field of research is Social Geography with urban identity as the studied focus. Her most recent publications look at the quotidian lives of the Indian community in Malaysia. A perspective on Indian adolescents and Indian women have been covered in Aspirations of Young Adults in Urban Asia (2021) and Malaysia's Qualitative Research Journal (Vol 7 (1), 2021) respectively.
